

Companions of Imam Hussein (Peace Be Upon Him) in the Historical Literature

Abstract

Our study came to try to shed light on a good group that believed in their Lord and His victory, so He increased them in guidance and insight, tied their hearts, raised their status, raised their word, and immortalized their remembrance, so they became truly the title of virtues and values. They lived it, until it elevated them to the highest degrees of humanity and reached the stages of perfection, and there is no doubt that with their faith, steadfastness, and defiance, they carried the noblest principles, morals, and values in the universe. The research aims to know the names of the supporters of Imam Hussein (peace be upon him) who were martyred with him in Karbala from among the Hashemites, and most of them were from the Abi Talib family, so some historians called them (the Talibis), and the names of the non-Hashemite supporters whose names differed in historical sources and blogs as well as their number, so We counted them and listed their names in tables.

Introduction

The problems I encountered in writing this study are many. Because the newsmen and historians did not care to narrate and record the names of men and women who participated in this revolution in one way or another or tried to participate in it, and circumstances prevented him from doing so, just as we do not know anything of value about the social circles from which many or most of these supporters emerged; Because the material is almost missing in the sources, and there are no translations for most of the men in the primary sources (1). The talk about the supporters of Imam Al-Hussain (peace be upon him) is a talk about the best supporters in rank and the most named of them, not because they were killed in the path of God Almighty, but because they were killed in a period of time in which the supporter was few and people flocked to the world and because they were strangers, and no one would mix with them or agree with them on their approach from (2). That crowd is an individual who fears God Almighty, because they were distinguished from other supporters because they were aware of their testimony and their morals, certain that they would not remain in the life of this world, and despite that they went with their imam and role model (3), reconciling themselves to the meeting of God Almighty, armored with hearts over shields, and rejoicing in what God Almighty has stored up. Exalted be He for them, racing to martyrdom, advising each other of their imam and role model (peace be upon him) (4), and wishing that they had more than one body and soul to sacrifice that for the sake of defending an imam of truthful certainty, and for a religion for which blood was shed, joys were sacrificed, eyes were awake, and bodies were tired (5, 6).

The importance of this study stems from the statement of the names of a good group of the mujahideen believers who accompanied Imam Hussein (peace be upon him) with his wealth in confronting tyranny and spreading the values of virtue, after the Umayyads violated human humanity (7-10) and legislated unjust rulings, and whose names were scattered in historical sources and blogs. In order for the research to stand on the names mentioned by the historical blogs, and some of them have been mentioned in the procedural application (11-14), and we will present a methodological statistical appendix, and the research had to mention the names of the Hashemites

who were martyred with Imam Hussein (peace be upon him), and the narration differed in several of those who were martyred In Karbala other than Al-Hussein (peace be upon him) from Ahl al-Bayt (peace be upon them).

According to Al-Masoudi, they are thirteen men (15), and it is, according to what we have seen from the narrations, the smallest number. It was narrated that he was killed among them with Al-Hussein in Karbala. And a narration reported by Al-Khwarizmi on the authority of Al-Laith bin Saad included the names of fourteen of them (16). Earth is similar. The visit attributed to the district includes the names of seventeen of them (other than Al-Hussein bin Ali), and it is (17-19), in terms of number, in accordance with the narration of Sheikh Al-Mufid (20) where he said: (The number of those who were killed with Al-Hussein (peace be upon him) from the people of his house in the kindness of Karbala are seven. Ten souls, Al-Hussein bin Ali (peace be upon him) is eighteen, and these two narrations agree, in terms of number, with the narration of Al-Tabari (21-24), as he counted the martyrs nineteen of them (Muslim bin Aqeel), and among them: Abu Bakr bin Ali bin Abi Talib. He said about him: (doubt about his killing) So the rest is with Al-Tabari, and they are the ones who confirmed (25-27) their martyrdom in Karbala, seventeen men, and he is in agreement with the visitation and Sheikh Al-Mufid. Seventeen men from his family were killed along with Al-Hussein, peace be upon him (28).

And Abu Al-Faraj Al-Isfahani (29) said after presenting the names of the martyrs of Bani Hashem: (So all those who were killed on the Day of Kinder from the sons of Abi Talib except for those who differ in his matter are twenty-two men). Imam al-Hussein and Muslim ibn Aqil (peace be upon them both) were counted among the martyrs (30-33), and they were delusional about it as it is known, since a Muslim was not among those who were killed on the day of al-Taff. And the largest number narrated that he was martyred from Ahl al-Bayt in Karbala, according to what (34-37) we have seen from the narrations, is twenty-five men. They were twenty-seven...) And he mentioned their names after this, and among them are names (38-41): (Al-Hussein bin Ali bin Abi Talib, and Muslim bin Aqeel bin Abi Talib (peace be upon them)), and these names we mentioned as in the narration of Muhammad Mahdi Shams al-Din, and we will show (42, 43) them in the following table :

Before entering into mentioning the details of the names of the non-Hashemite martyrs in Karbala, it must be mentioned that the historical sources, the books of the fighter, the visits, and the accounts of the contemporaries of Ahl al-Bayt (peace be upon them) have differed in stating the real number of them, and in order to remove the confusion and the difference between what came in those sources We will present in this section a statistical table with the names of the martyrs (44, 45) and the frequency of names in the sources for each of them, as follows:

Conclusions :

After extrapolating the sources, books of visits, fighters, and narrations in search of the names or number of non-Hashemite martyrs; In order to achieve what the historians differed about in their number, the research found that some of the martyrs had their names mentioned repeatedly, or in a copy, or distorted, and some of them were mentioned in the narrations of Ahl al-Bayt (peace be upon them), while the historical sources that dealt with the Karbala incident did not mention them, and that ambiguity was removed by what Dr. Muhammad Hussein Ali Al-Saghir in his book (Imam Al-Hussein (peace be upon him), the giant of revolutionary thought); He mentioned them (may God be pleased with them), so he mentioned the sources that mentioned them, so he deliberately mentioned them to serve the research.
